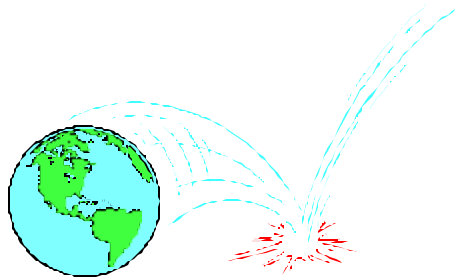


The Helen McSpadden Memorial Endowment

The **Helen McSpadden Memorial Endowment** was established by Epsilon Epsilon #1896 Chapter (Denver, Colorado) of ESA International in 1988. Its specific criterion is for a Colorado resident for continuing education with any major. The first scholarship was awarded in 1989.

Judging Criteria A: This scholarship is weighted evenly to Financial Need and Scholastic Ability: Scoring 100 points, the distribution is 10 points for Character, 20 points for Leadership, 10 points for Service, 30 points for Financial Need and 30 points for Scholastic Ability.
